INTRODUCTION : ETHOS & HISTORY

STUDENT KITS

Know The School

- 1) **Can my child celebrate his/her birthday in school?**
 - Children can wear civil dress and bring sweets to distribute to other children. However, no child is allowed to bring presents or cake on their birthday.
- 2) **Is my child allowed to carry money to school?**
 - Parents are advised not to allow their children to carry money to school.
- 3) **How do I get in touch with the school authorities/ teachers?**
 - There are several ways of communicating with the school. The key link is the Almanac. Apart from this, for one-to-one interaction, the school conducts an 'Open House' which is compulsory for all Parents to attend. More over the parents can feel free to write to the school authorities at any time and our interactive web site and e- mail are always at your service.
- 4) **What do I need to do if my address has changed?**
 - Parents should inform the school if there is any change in their address and telephone numbers at the school administrative office.
- 5) **How do I recover my child's lost belongings?**
 - The name, class and section of the student should be clearly marked on all his/ her belongings. In case your ward has lost any of his/her belongings, the parents can inform the class teacher/FOE and get the matter resolved.
- 6) **What is the procedure if my child has to take leave of absence for a few days?**
 - The class teacher should be informed about the leave through the given form in the Almanac, written application duly signed by parents.

- 7) **What will happen if my child's Identity card is lost or mutilated?**
- Mutilation resulting from normal wear and tear is replaced on the payment of Rs 50. The replacement of the lost Student's Identity card or the Authority Card will be made on the payment of Rs. 100.
- 8) **Can my child's bus stop be changed?**
- No. The bus stops cannot be changed to suit individual needs. However the request for change will be considered for Exceptional cases and for the change of residence. The change will be subjected to the vacancy in the bus opted for.
- 9) **Is my child permitted to board another bus if he/she has missed his/her designated bus?**
- Absolutely not. Under no circumstances will the child be allowed to board another bus. Parents are strongly advised not to pursue another bus driver or bus in-charge for this.
- 10) **Is my child allowed to leave the school premises during the School hours?**
- The child is allowed to leave under an emergency or in exceptional cases. For availing leave during school hours, a prior application should be submitted. The child will be issued a gate pass authorised by the concerned authority on production of the child's Authority Card. Also, a special log book has to be signed at the security by the person authorised to escort the child out of the campus.
- 11) **Can my child go to or come from the bus stop unescorted?**
- Normally no, especially with respect to students up to class 2nd. In case no one comes to collect the child from the bus stop, the bus driver/ bus in-charge will drop the child at the nearest location designated for this by the school. In such cases you will be informed telephonically.
- 12) **Who ensures the safety of my child in the bus?**
- The designated bus in-charge/ Conductor will maintain discipline in the bus. In fact Rajendra Public School buses

- conform to strict guidelines issued/laid down by the Supreme Court.
- 13) **Does my child need any extra help in his/her academic work?**
- If by this you imply 'tuition', the answer is a very emphatic 'no'. The only assistance he/she requires is your monitoring. The academic plan followed at Rajendra Public School has been designed to make your child self sufficient in his/her studies. If needed, the school provides necessary inputs for slow learners and for the children with special abilities.
- 14) **Can we be provided the school bus mobile phone number?**
- On principle, no one is provided the phone numbers of the bus drivers. In case you need to provide any urgent last minute information, you can ring up the School/ Administrative office and your message will be conveyed to the bus in-charge of your child's bus.
- 14) **If the bus is delayed on the return journey what should I do?**
- Due to heavy rush hour traffic or other unforeseen traffic jams like processions etc, the school bus may be delayed. Under such circumstances, you may call the school/ administrative office and get further information.
- 15) **What are your rules for half day leave?**
- In case half day leave is required, an application regarding the same must be submitted to the class teacher. The parent/guardian must come to drop/pick up the child depending on which half (morning/afternoon) the leave is availed.

EXAMINATION & PROMOTION

The School follows a system of cumulative assessment. There are Assignments, projects, unit test and Terminal Examinations .Marks obtained in all these are taken in aggregate for promotion of the child to next class. Obtaining a minimum of

promotion.

Grade System, as per CBSE guidelines, is used up to class X and students are evaluated in terms of the same.

The Assessment Record based on continuous assessment of a student's work is sent to the parents with the result of each Terminal Exam /Assessment in each academic session.

A minimum of 90% attendance is compulsory for a student to be eligible to sit for the annual exam.

Examinations /Tests are legal and of utmost importance .A student must appear in all exams and tests to claim for merit award .Re-test or re-exam shall not be conducted under any circumstances .The decision of the Principal regarding promotion shall be final and binding and will not be reconsidered.

Only Scrutiny of marks to a maximum of two subjects of the Half Yearly, Annual & Pre-board Exam is allowed, within seven days from the declaration of the result, on written request from parents with a scrutiny fee of RS. 100 /- per subject.

A WORD TO THE STUDENTS

1. Come to the school clean, well groomed and in proper uniform with school shoes well polished.
2. Be regular in attendance and never be late to the school.
3. Be regular with your class and home assignment and correction of the same by the subject teachers.
4. Be courteous and respectful to the parents, teachers and visitors.
